David W. Fentress Family Letters, 1856-1869

The letters of David W. Fentress, a Confederate physician from Texas, concern his experiences in the army in Arkansas (1862-1863), Louisiana (1864), and Texas (1862, 1865). The collection includes, also, letters from his mother, Maud C. Fentress, from Bolivar, Tennessee (1856-1869) and are grouped first by the author of the letters and then arranged roughly chronologically.
