

## How to Find Art Education Books in the UNT Libraries

1. Go to the UNT Libraries home page:  
<http://www.library.unt.edu/>
2. Choose [UNT Online Catalog](#), or [Find E-Books](#) (only finds e-books)
3. Search as shown in the examples below.

### Author search example:

To search for information written by an educator, choose *author* search and type the name of the author (last name, first name).  
Example: *Lowenfeld, Viktor*.

### Art Educator search example:

To find books about the art educator, choose the *keyword or subject* search and enter the name. Example: *Lowenfeld, Viktor*.

### Art Education Topic search:

Choose *keyword* search. Search examples: *Art Education and History, DBAE, "Aesthetic Education", "Progressive Movement", "Social Darwinism"*.

## How to Find & Borrow Books from other Universities

To find out what books are published on your topic that not owned by the UNT Libraries, search the World Catalog.

1. Go to the UNT Libraries home page:

2. Choose "[Electronic Resources](#)"
3. Click "[W](#)" from the A-Z listing.
3. Scroll down and click on "[WorldCat](#)".

## Art Education Journal Articles

Search the databases listed below to find art education journal articles.

### To Get to the Journal Databases:

1. Go to the UNT Libraries home page:  
<http://www.library.unt.edu>
2. Choose "[Electronic Resources](#)".
3. Choose the first letter of the title of the database from the A-Z list.
4. Click on the name of the database.

\*If you are accessing off campus, you will be asked for a username (EUID), and password (EUID password).

### [ERIC](#)

ERIC is the premier education database. It includes thousands of journal articles on art education topics.

### [Education Research Complete](#)

Education Research Complete contains journal articles from over 1,500 educational journals and many conference papers.

### [Professional Development Collection](#)

Professional Development Collection database provides a highly specialized collection of nearly 550 high quality education journals, including more than 350 peer-reviewed titles, and contains more than 200 educational reports.

### [Art & Architecture Complete](#) 1984-present

Art & Architecture Complete offers journal articles from over 400 art and architecture periodicals published throughout the world. Subjects include Advertising Art, Antiques, Archaeology, Architectural History, Art History, Crafts, Decorative Arts, Folk Art, Graphic Arts, Industrial Design, Interior Design, Landscape Architecture, Motion Pictures, Museology, Non-Western Art, Painting, Photography, Pottery, Sculpture, Television, Textiles.

[Art Bibliographies Modern](#) 1980-present  
Includes all areas of art from the modern era (1850-present), with a particular concentration on photography. Contains abstracts of over 500 periodical articles, exhibition catalogs, and dissertations.

### [Bibliography of the History of Art](#)

1973-present

The Bibliography of the History of Art (BHA), contains over 665,000 citations from 1,400 journals, conference proceedings, books, essays, dissertations, and exhibition catalogs. Subject coverage includes painting, sculpture, architecture, drawing, prints, and decorative and applied arts from antiquity to the present.

### [JSTOR](#)

JSTOR contains all full-text journal articles from thousands of journals in the humanities. JSTOR has the deepest archives of all databases, so it may be necessary to use many keywords separated by "AND" to limit your search. Example: *Aesthetics and "art education" and history*.

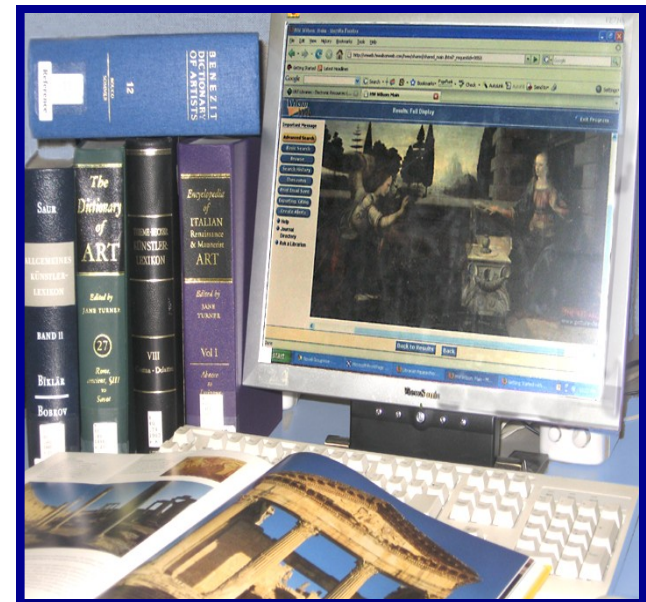
